Solar Survey

In the last couple of years, several neighborhood associations in the Portland Metro area have run "solarize" projects. If enough homeowners are interested in being part of it, the installer can offer substantial discounts to the group. Everyone wins.

Solarize projects connect a group of homeowners with a chosen solar panel installer (or installers) who can provide:

- Education/information about solar panel installation, through a series of workshops.
- Assessment of homes of interested homeowners for the appropriateness of solar energy to their site.
- Required permits and communications with involved utility and State agencies.
- Installation of solar panels on the homes

Interest in installing solar panels has increased in the Association and your Board of Directors wants to know if the level of interest is enough for a project of this type to be successful here.
